
- > Founded: 1990 by Myrtle Faye Rumph, family and friends



# POSITIVE DISCIPLINE



- We believe that youth should be continually encouraged. This means we subscribe to a
  positive discipline approach where positive behaviors are encouraged,
  recognized and rewarded.
- ★ We believe that good behavior should be mentioned more often than not.
- We instruct and encourage students by telling them what to do and why we want them to do it (Walk in the hall. It's not safe to run inside this area.)
- We teach our youth to think before they act and to resolve conflicts with words offering solutions. Our goal is to teach responsible behavior to empower youth to manage themselves--with or without adult intervention. To earn their respect and instill confidence, we refrain from demeaning or disrespecting children in any manner.
- We are very careful with the young minds and spirits that have been entrusted to us. We are firm, yet caring. We present consequences that are clear and fair. We focus on a child's strengths and potentials and not on their shortcomings.
- We are careful to ensure that our demeanors and attitudes do not discourage children or provoke disobedience.
- ◆ We set an example in how we behave and treat and respect others.
- We seek to build friendship between students rather than play favorites that can divide. Students will receive consequences for their own actions, not another's—except at times when group behaviors are being addressed.
- We will never use academics such as extra homework or standards to punish students; instead we will delay privileges through time out or notify parents for their assistance.
- As staff, parents and volunteers at the Al Wooten Jr. Heritage Center, we pledge to always strive to maintain an environment that is safe, nurturing and enjoyable for everyone.

#### What is Wooten Online?

Established in response to school closures and social distancing precautions, Wooten Online offers free online educational support services to help students in achieving at-home learning. Activities will resume at our youth center at 91st and Western in Los Angeles after LAUSD reopens.

#### What do we offer?

### • Free private tutoring

Parents can schedule private tutoring sessions in math and language arts. Students work one-on-one with a <u>Wooten Online teacher</u>, including volunteers from Pepperdine, LMU and USC. Parents can book up to two sessions per subject, per week.

### • Free i-Ready diagnostics in reading and math

Students can receive diagnostics in reading and math to help determine grade-level proficiency based on state content standards. Support for online and offline tutoring is based on test results.

#### · Classes, workshops, etc.



- Checks for child abuse and neglect provided by center
- Reference and social media checks (2 reference checks)
- No convictions or pending violent offenses, including domestic violence
- No recent drug arrests or convictions
- Must be off probation or parole
- Aptitude tests in math and language arts for tutors
- Teaching demonstration for tutors
- Agreement to abide by Pledge for Positive Discipline
- Additional references or training may be requested
